In future Exchange Act periodic reports, please expand your disclosure of your leasing activities for the reported period to include a discussion of the volume of new or renewed leases, tenant improvement costs, and leasing commissions. These should be presented on a per square foot basis. Also, please compare new rents on new and renewed leases to prior rent based on effective rent. In addition, to the extent you have material lease expirations in the next year, please include disclosure regarding the relationship of rents on expiring leases to market rents.
